Conference Venue (www.hebronhall.org)

Set in 7½ acres of grounds, Hebron Hall Christian Centre is located on the outskirts of the village of Dinas Powys, only four miles southwest of Cardiff (complete with Cardiff Castle, Welsh Assembly, Millennium Stadium, etc.), within the beautiful Vale of Glamorgan. Hebron Hall is just a few miles from the coast (e.g., Barry and Penarth) and Cardiff Bay, a freshwater lake separated from the sea by a barrage.

Conference Travel

- *By air*: The nearest major airports are Cardiff Airport (CWL) and Bristol Airport (BRS). Hebron Hall is approximately 10 minutes drive from Cardiff Airport and 1 to 1½ hours from Bristol Airport. Taxis are available from Cardiff Airport to Hebron Hall. A bus runs from Bristol Airport to Bristol train station, and a train goes from Bristol to Cardiff (www.nationalrail.co.uk). If you are flying within the British Isles or Europe, there are discount airlines that fly into Bristol and/or Cardiff (www.easyjet.com, www.ryanair.com, www.flybe.com, www.bmibaby.com).
- *By rail*: Hebron Hall is just a short walk from the Dinas Powys train station. Trains run frequently from Cardiff Centre to Dinas Powys.
- *By road*: Hebron Hall is only a few miles south of Junction 33 of the M4 (www.hebron-hall.org/directions.php).

Conference Day Trips by Coach

Day Trip 1 (£10)

- Bath, known as Aquae Sulis to the Romans, is a World Heritage Site and the only town in the United Kingdom offering visitors the opportunity to bathe in naturally heated spring waters. Attractions of this beautiful old city include the 57-acre Royal Victoria Park (with a superb children’s play area, pond, arboretum, bird aviary, etc.), the Royal Crescent, the Jane Austen Centre, etc. (www.visitbath.co.uk). Go off and explore on your own; site-seeing (on-off) buses and walking tours are available.

Day Trip 2 (£20, including entry fees and tour guides for both attractions)

- Tintern Abbey, founded in 1131, is the best-preserved medieval abbey in Wales (www.castlewales.com/tintern.html). Situated in the wooded valley of the River Wye, this picturesque and romantic abbey inspired the poetry of Wordsworth and Tennyson and the paintings of Turner. Our tour guide, adorned in monastic garb, will describe the history and life of Tintern Abbey, the first Cistercian abbey in Wales.
- Caerphilly Castle is the largest castle in Wales, surrounded by a series of moats and islands and complete with leaning tower and siege engines (www.greatcastlesofwales.co.uk/caerphilly.htm). A professional guide will illumine our tour of this thirteenth-century Norman castle, oft threatened but never conquered. It is now situated in the midst of a little town and its shopping district—a striking mixture of old and new.

On-site Activities (www.hebronhall.org/leisurefacilities.php)

Hebron Hall has an indoor, 20 metre, heated swimming pool which will be available at set times. There is an indoor sports hall for 5-a-side football, volleyball, basketball, etc. Two outdoor tennis courts are available for those who bring their own racquets and balls. There is also an indoor games room with a pool table, snooker table and table-tennis table.

- Accommodation is full board; bedding and towels are provided; please bring your own pillow case.
- All rooms are en-suite with varying numbers of single beds.
